1. Introductions and apologies

2. Minutes of the last meeting

The minutes of the meeting on 18 May 2010 were agreed as a true record.

3. Matter arising

Healthy Ambitions Pathway — No update.

Awards - Mid Yorkshire Hospitals awarded an excellence in service delivery award for work around learning disability complex pathways to treatment. This will also be put forward for a Health and Social Care Award.

A nomination has also been put forward for the work that Marie has been doing, the work of the Patient Experience Group and the work around the Directed Enhanced Service (DES).

QIPP - Phil explained that Quality Innovation Productivity Prevention (QIPP) is putting more emphasis on financial savings.

CTLD Audit Report — Please see attached report.

Self Assessment — The validation meeting with the Strategic Health Authority has taken place and it went well. We are still waiting for confirmation in writing regarding areas for improvement.

4. Learning Disability Assessment Framework

The group read through the framework. Our overall scoring is amber, which is a fair reflection.

5. Health Delivery Plan review

6. Post DES training

A post DES training plan has been completed and attempts have been made to offer the training proposal to local providers for their consideration. SWYPFT have expressed an interest and are bringing together a response.

The proposed training is in response to the evaluations of the learning disability awareness sessions delivered to GP practices in 2009.

7. LD DES evaluation update

Marie and Stephanie have pulled some useful information together from the people involved in the pilot and Stephanie has sent out a letter to GP surgeries asking them to be involved in the evaluation. Due to poor uptake she will be sending the letter out again.

8. Green Light Toolkit

The group read through the baseline assessment. The assessment gives us an idea of our position in Wakefield. People with learning disabilities in Wakefield are no more disadvantaged than the rest of the population in accessing mental health services.

Ann had a meeting with Jim Leyland and Louise Hamilton for clarity around some issues and she asked Marie Gibb to involve the Patient Experience Group in this work.

Phil said that the Mental Health Strategy (New Horizons) was going to be refreshed.

In Wakefield we have a Pooled Budget so overall the assessment is a really positive.

Ann said that a Trust wide group are looking at training in learning disabilities for mental health staff and mental health training for learning disability staff. A training pack will be available soon.

9. Hospital Liaison Nurse

Peter Kirwan will be starting a 12 month secondment post as Acute Liaison Nurse in Mid Yorkshire Hospitals on 09 August. He is currently a Community Nurse working in the Community Team for Learning Disabilities North Team.

Peter will be making sure that people with learning disabilities and their carers have a better experience when they have to go in to hospital. In particular he will be working in Accident and Emergency departments across Pinderfields, Pontefract and Dewsbury Hospitals.

There will be an evaluation to find out how the role has made a difference and we will have to look at other ways of funding it next year.

10. Any Other Business

- ◆ **Care Quality Commission (CQC) review** — Kate Firth told the group that CQC were due to start a review of learning disabilities in May but this is on hold. She thinks it will now take place in October.
- ◆ **Clear pathway for parents with learning disabilities** — Ann said that a Safeguarding Midwife for Safeguarding Children and Domestic Violence is putting together a clear pathway so both parents with learning disabilities and professionals know where to go for help. She will be writing to all agencies and inviting them to get together to discuss the pathway. It has taken 2 years to get this far.
