<p>3</p>	<p>Health Trainers</p> <p>Sharon and Denise are Health Trainers from NHS Wakefield District PCT. They came to talk to the group about how to improve your health, make choices about your health and to increase the amount of exercise you take. Health Trainers provide a one to one assessment of your needs and make suggestions how to make changes happen. They support people by making an individual plan focused on improving your health.</p> <p>Denise and Sharon gave lots of information about their service and asked for support from the group to make their leaflet accessible for people with learning disabilities.</p>	
<p>4</p>	<p>Annual Health Checks</p> <p>Marie gave a presentation about Annual Health Checks for people with learning disabilities in Wakefield. 660 people out of 1128 people eligible have received a health check in year 2 of the service. This is good progress but this must improve in year 3. Catherine Horbury talked about her experience of having a health check.</p>	
<p>5</p>	<p>Learning Disability Awards</p> <p>We discussed the Learning Disability Health Awards and the meeting agreed that services should be rewarded for delivering good care and treatment for people with learning disabilities. Marie asked for volunteers to work out the criteria for the awards, how services should be assessed and what the awards should look like.
